

Minutes of meeting held in the chamber of Secretary (Sports) on 31st May, 2018 to consider the ACTC proposal of "All India Council for Deaf" (AISCD) for the year 2018-19.

Secretary (Sports) chaired the meeting. Director (Sports), MYAS, Section Officer, MYAS, Regional Director (TEAMS), Project Officer in-charge and others attended. From "All India Council for Deaf" (AISCD) the following were present.

2. Project Officer in-charge informed that:-

- Disciplines under AISCD are categorized under "Priority" category.
- Budget allocation for 2016-17 was Rs. 80.00 lakh and in 2017-18, it was Rs.200.00 lakh, as this year was Deaflympic. The council fully utilized the budget last year. This year (2018-19) Rs. 249.00 lakh has been proposed.
- SAI conducted Selection Trials at different SAI Centres, including Golf Course at Dhaula Kuan and R.K. Khanna Lawn Tennis Stadium, New Delhi for participation in Deaflympic 2017.
- Deaflympics is held once in 4 years. Last time it was held in Turkey in 2017.
- In eight (8) disciplines, the players have potential. Earlier, the players won medals in Tennis, Badminton and Wrestling; however, no medal in Swimming.
- In "Pole Vault", event high standard was maintained at par with able-bodied athletes AISCD.
- In "Golf", players also play with able-bodied sportpersons and win medals.
- Our players are not at-par with international standard in the disciplines of Football, Volleyball, Basketball.
- No Escort is sent along with the players. SAI Coaches normally go with them along with the Interpreter.
- Our focus should be on the performance of the player in the next Deaflympics to be held in 2021.

3. AISCD informed that, they require an Office in Delhi with no cost to the Federation. Secretary (Sports) observed that government would not be in a position to finance for setting up an office in Delhi of any Federation. He added that:-

- Auditing of account of the Federation should be carried out through Chartered Accountant whose name is empanelled for such purpose by the C&AG.
- Since the AISCD is located in Delhi, they are entitled for having an Asstt. Secretary; however, they should follow the proper procedure for selection of an Asstt. Secretary. In the First insistence, they may submit a self-contained note to the Ministry in this regard.
- Opportunity should be given to the players for participation in every discipline, as "sports" not only winning medals but also to encourage participation in sports.
- AISCD should have a normal Coach who can interact with Deaf players through signs.
- The Coach of Ms. Diksha Dagar (Golf Discipline) who would participate in the Dublin World Championship in July, 2018, would not accompany her at govt. cost. He would accompany his daughter at his own cost, as per the existing policy.

4. Thereafter, the ACTC proposal was taken up for consideration. Various components of ACTC proposal were discussed and following decision were taken. Component-wise details are given under:-

(i) National Coaching Camp (Men & Women)

- Federation proposed 10 Coaching Camps in 2018-19. These camps are preparatory for participation in the various international tournaments. However, PO in-charge informed that, the players would not be in a position to participate in all international tournaments, as their standards will not meet the International standard in these tournaments. Therefore, no useful purpose would be served in having coaching camp prior to participation in the International Tournaments.
- Agreeing with the PO in-charge, the meeting approved four (4) coaching camps. However, it is now understood that, AISCD had not held the camp, which was to be held from 01st – 10th June, 2018 at Gandhinagar. Therefore, the amount proposed for the camp in the ACTC proposal would not be allowed.
- Details of the other 3 Camps approved in the meeting are at **Annexure-'A'**.
- Names of Campers for these 3 camps would be known, after selection trials are over. Further, the financial support for the camps would be provided as per norms of the scheme of assistance to NSFs.
- Total amount approved for the 3 camps is Rs. 13.49 lakhs (worked out as per norms).

(ii) International Competitions (Men & Women)

- Federation proposed participation of players in ten (10) International Competitions upto March, 2019. Out of 10 foreign exposures, the meeting approved six (6) foreign exposures only. Details are given at **Annexure- 'B'** . The amount admissible for each exposure has been worked out as per govt. norms and shown against each. The total amount works out to Rs.81.42 lakhs.

Note:- The actual amount admissible for each exposure, after AISCD submits proposal would be worked out again as per norms and with the approval of the Competent Authority financial support would be released. Changes in the numbers of players, coaches etc. would be taken into account at the time of consideration of the proposal of the Federation.

(iii) National Championship (Men)

- Federation proposed three (3) National Championships at a total cost of Rs.60.00 lakhs. However, as per the scheme of assistance to NSFs Rs.22.00 lakhs only is admissible for conduct of National Championships for Senior, Junior, Sub-Junior. Therefore, the meeting approved Rs.22.00 lakhs only to AISCD for conduct of National Championship subject to the condition that the Championship would be for all the 3 age categories of Senior, Junior, Sub-Junior. PO in-charge would be ensured this when the proposal is received from AISCD.

5. Thus, the total amount approved for AISCD under ACTC 2018-19 is **Rs116.90 lakh**. Component-wise details as are follows:-
